The Chicago style provides two systems for giving credit to the sources you use. Choose either:

- 1. **the notes-bibliography system:** use this system to create footnotes or endnotes for specific citations (use column 1a below) **and** a bibliography at the end of your work, arranged in alphabetical order, that provides full details about your sources (use column 1b below)

 OR
- 2. **the author-date system:** use this system to create specific parenthetical citations throughout your work (use column 2a below) **and** a reference list at the end of your work, arranged in alphabetical order, that provides full details about your cited sources (use column 2b below)

General notes for using the examples in this guide:

- Start by looking for examples that match the types of information you need to cite. If you have any questions, please consult your professor or a librarian.
- In the notes-bibliography system:
 - Notes (column 1a below) are usually structured like this: 1. Author's last name, title or partial title, page(s) cited
 - All examples in this guide use the shortened form of notes (see sec. 14.24 14.25)
 - Bibliography entries (column 1b below) usually contain, in the following order:
 - Author/creator information (see the examples below for scenarios with multiple authors, etc.)
 - Title information (see the examples below for title variations)
 - Publication information (e.g., place of publication, publisher name, and publication date for books; volume and issue numbers for journal articles; URLs for online resources)
- In the author-date system:
 - o In-text citations (column 2a below) are usually structured like this: (Author's last name publication date, page(s) cited)
 - o Reference list entries (column 2b below) usually contain, in the following order:
 - Author/creator information (see the examples below for scenarios with multiple authors, etc.)
 - Publication date
 - Title information (see the examples below for title variations)
 - Publication information (e.g., place of publication and publisher name for books; volume and issue numbers for journal articles; URLs for online resources)
- Notes, bibliographies, and reference list entries are always single-spaced. See the Chicago manual (p. 686 and p. 788) for examples.



Deciphering Citations

The following was created to help make sense of the elements within a citation.

This example uses the **notes-bibliography system** and is based on a journal article in print or PDF format.



This example uses the author-date system and is based on a journal article in print or PDF format.

Author(s)

First author's name is inverted (last name followed by a comma then first name and middle name in full (if given))

For more than one author, insert a comma after the first author's first name(s) then add the additional author(s) names in full (not inverted)

Separate authors' names with a comma

Separate second last and last authors' names with the word "and"

End with a period

Article Title

Enclose the title in quotation marks

Capitalize all principal words in the title (e.g. not words such as "of", "the", "is")

End the title with a period

Journal Title

Italicize journal title

Capitalize all principal words (e.g. not words such as "of", "the", "is")

If the title of the journal starts with the word "The", omit it

Format

Single-spaced with a hanging indent

Volume/Issue

Give volume number followed by issue number (if given) in parentheses, followed by a comma

Page Numbers

Inclusive page numbers for the entire article, separated by a dash and followed by a period

Date of Publication

Place year of publication in parentheses, followed by a colon
